My favorite part of sewing is collecting everything on the notions wall, handling beautiful fabric, and buying for my stash. I like everything that leads up to sewing, surrounds it, and results from it. I love planning projects, searching for just the right fabric, looking for that special button or trim. I even like considering a bigger and better machine; but I reluctantly admit that I don't really like to sit and sew!

I confess to being a fit snob. I like comfortable, proper fitting clothes that hide my lumps and bumps. I like hanging out with people who sew and those like me, who are still learning; and I like people who appreciate quality and set high standards, but don't take themselves too seriously to help others.

I began sewing about a dozen years ago because my daughter and I developed bodies that don't fit into ready-to-wear. Commercial patterns don't work either. I started making slopers, hand-drafted patterns, and finally, using software to develop *THE* "perfect" pattern. I'm still on that quest. Fortunately, I have great teachers and friends for encouragement.

I've got a wonderful (and way too small) sewing room. In there I have all the necessary tools like electric scissors, razor sharp rotary cutters and more than my share of shears, clippers, and scissors, and, of course, I have sewing machines, embroidery machines, sergers, etc. All this technology, along with using patternmaking software, has forced me to get some understanding of computers and how technology is controlling much of the sewing world now.

I am also keen on attending meetings, workshops and retreats where I meet people who sew and do beautiful tailoring, quilting, and embroidery. I've met others who dream about what they are going to create "someday." Anyone with sewing in her blood is my kind of person.

I am starting out the new feature with a project that I have completed. Being an avid garment maker, of course I would choose to review a pattern, but more than that I want to encourage you to take a look at the Shirt Collection at **Brensan Studios**. <http://www.brensan.com/>



Her patterns are beautiful and the fun thing about her shirt collection is that all of the sleeves in the collection are interchangeable with the other shirt patterns and some of the collars are as well. That way you can have an entire wardrobe of blouses after getting the body of one shirt to fit you. I purchased the Barcelona, the pattern on the left. I found the patterns easy to work with and the pieces went together without problems. As in the case of most patterns, she recommends making a muslin or test garment first so that the design lines are for your fit.



excellent. I had no I have turned up one same trim as the collar and center front trim.

On the left is a picture of my finished blouse made from the Barcelona pattern. The instructions on putting the blouse together are trouble sewing on the trim going down the front sleeve cuff to show that it is faced with the

I must confess that this is my test blouse made from a fabric that was given to me. Large blue roses somehow are not my style. However, I like the way it turned out so well that I will definitely wear it. The fit is great. I would definitely recommend these patterns to those who make garments. My only reservation is that this particular pattern is not for the beginning sewer. That being said, if you can follow directions and have a sewing friend to help you, you can make this blouse. She does have other patterns that would be easier. Take a look at her web page <http://www.brensan.com/> to see what you might like. She has a lot more than just blouse patterns.
